### 2020 WILL SEE SAFE TANK ACCESS AS A FOCUS



In the January Newsletter we began the 2020 focus for safe site and tank access. As we review our Corrective Action Requests, Incidents and accidents for 2019 what has become apparent is the need to take a tougher stance on some of the issues being faced by fuel delivery drivers when it comes to their safety. While often something like the

concrete

post in this picture (above) can look quite innocuous the reality is that a slip, trip or fall from on the ladder (the most common accident) could result in an extremely bad injury. The photo on the right shows the ladder obstructed by a drum which again while it could be worked around a trip, slip or fall could have serious consequences. As always we are really keen to work with customers to rectify these issues so that we keep everyone safe from harm. ### HAVE YOU GOT YOUR MCFALL FUEL FUELCARD?

"We have a growing number of customers who comment on the convenience of the McFall

Fuel, fuelcard because it can be used at BP Connect, BP2Go, G.A.S, BP Truckstops and of course our retail sites in Taranaki and Kapiti. The card can also be used at McFall Fuel Truckstops in Kimbolton, Waverley, Marton, and Ohakune. The customer pricing remains consistent no matter where the card is used. The card details do need to be loaded to each of our



truckstops," said Shona McGahan who looks after the McFall Fuel Fuelcards.

The unmanned McFall Fuel sites require pre-payment before any of the pumps can be used. As the OPT's don't know how much fuel each customer will pump, they are set to automatically pre-authorise a set dollar amount per transaction. If you do not have enough cleared funds in your account, the transaction will be declined and no fuel will be dispensed. When you hang up the nozzle after filling your vehicle the final transaction amount is calculated and replaces the dollar amount that has been pre-authorised. We have been advised by the major NZ banks that this process can take up to five working days, at which time the pre-authorised amount will disappear from your account and be replaced with the actual transaction total.
