The Forest Industry Safety Summit saw a group of first class speakers who all provided excellent approaches to take to achieve the ultimate goal of Zero Harm in the workplace through creating blame free cultures and positive teamwork. What is apparent that excellence through expectations, ongoing accountability with high level communication, and a willingness to learn is essential. Steve Falk from Switchback Systems in Canada provided an entertaining way to consider how to understand yourself and each other better

in the work place as a step forward to creating dynamic teams. His simple but humorous approach challenged attendees to think about their responses when an error was made—who saw me do it, I can solve this by myself, and surely I can bury the evidence. All the very things that we do not want happening. Learning to ask for help and helping others to be situation aware is the key to teamwork and of course creating the chance for others to consider what occurred and how everyone can avoid the same pitfall is important.

A recent survey among forestry workers rated what they saw as contributing to a 'Safe Workplace'. 42% team culture; 18% communication; 17% good equipment/machinery/ PPE; 12% training; 11% health and safety. Whatever the outcome of any survey SAFE means (S) simple to use; (A) accessible to employees; (F) functional; and (E) evolving.

BP has made some changes to the in-store odometer entry process allowing greater control of your fleet. The process is that drivers will now be prompted to enter the odometer reading using the EFTPOS pin pad. If you do not want the odometer information it is possible to skip this step.

This change will be rolled out across the BP network over the next few weeks and will be complete by early to mid April. When the rollout across the country is complete, this new process will be consistent for fuel card holders using BP Connect, BP 2go, and G.A.S sites.
