

### THE HISTORY OF 50 YEAR PARTNERSHIP



The first fully sponsored surf boat in New Zealand presented to the Worser Bay Surf Life-saving Club Inc., by Europa Oil (N.Z.) Limited, lands survivors rescued from the sea following the foundering of the Wahine on the 10th April, 1968.

McFall Fuel is proud of the long association its partner BP has had with Surf Life Saving New Zealand (SLSNZ) which began in 1968.

This commitment is believed to be New Zealand's longest unbroken corporate partnership and in 2018 will enter its 50th year. Surf Lifeguards around NZ have saved more than 54,000 lives, over the 50 years and the BP Inflatable Rescue Boats (IRBs) have been involved in more than 22,000 rescues. In early 1968 Europa donated a new surf boat, 'Miss Europa' to the Worser Bay Surf Club. On 10 April in that very same year, five Surf Lifeguards from Worser Bay battled

one of New Zealand's worst storms and rowed Miss Europa out into Wellington Harbour to help save the lives of passengers from the sinking Wahine ferry. After this tragic event, Europa wanted to play a larger role in the communities in which it operated and began a new relationship with SLSNZ.

The relationship evolved with the sponsorship of jet boats, medical scholarships and club equipment in the 1970s. In the early 1980s jet boats were replaced with the more reliable IRBs. In 1990 the Europa brand was replaced by BP and the relationship between BP and SLSNZ became even stronger, evolving into the relationship seen today. "BP is really proud of the enduring partnership with Surf Life Saving Clubs all around the country. Their courage in saving lives on our beaches is truly inspirational," said Debi Boffa, Managing Director BP NZ.

# TRUST POWER TECT RESCUE HELICOPTER

Every now and then it is worth reminding ourselves of just how important the Rescue Helicopters are in our communities. The 24/7 approach 365 days a year is vital when it comes to saving the lives of those in need, often in remote locations. Between March and August this year the Trust Power TECT Rescue Helicopter carried out a total of 81 missions, with 69% of these recognised as emergency and 19% of them hospital transfers. The need for the rescue service is



highlighted time and time again, particularly in life and death cases. There can be no hesitation if someone needs to be transferred quickly to get from one hospital to another for the specialist treatment. The flight nurse, doctor, midwife or paramedic are crucial in such cases. These people are trained to keep people alive - at 1500 metres or at an emergency scene, in challenging conditions or in the dark. The helicopter's 24/7 flight nurse roster includes teams from the hospital's **Critical Care and Intensive Care units** and Emergency Department.
