Beginning with the pain points the team at John Deere then worked towards the solution of Intelligent Boom Control to bring harvesters capabilities to a whole new level. The innovation provides more precise control of the boom tip reducing the learning curve for new operators, as well as making work easier and reducing fatigue during long days. The operator only controls the harvesters head and this has seen increased accuracy and greater productivity.

Other presenters also placed emphasis on the theme of more automation less labour to help solve the challenges of an aging workforce and the labour shortage number in of а industries. The innovative thinking also focused on safety being paramount and looking after the environment. NEW TECHNOLOGIES INTRODUCED FOR DRUG TESTING



TDDA recently announced the launch of three new state of the art workplace testing products that will detect a wider array of drugs more accurately. "As a group we wanted to be able to deliver the best possible oral fluid testing product to address the issue of prescription opiates and synthetic cannabinoids. A new device called ToxWipe ™ 7 provides fast, accurate and effective oral screening. Up to seven commonly abused drugs can be detected by this most comprehensive approach some of which fall under amphetamine type substances, cannabinoids, cocaine, metabolites, opiates, and oxycodone," said Errol Brain, TDDA General Manager Bay of Plenty & The Lakes.

Accurate results are produced with only a small sample volume. This helps to reduce the impact of dry mouth, a common problem with

oral fluid collection caused by a lack of available saliva. Further to this by September the TDDA 7 Panel Urine Cup with the new oxycodone strip will be in New Zealand. "We realise that opiates and opioids continue to be a growing issue and oxycodone is commonly prescribed. Now positive responses in routine drug screens will reveal its presence with the TDDA 7 Panel Urine Cup," said Errol.

The 3 Panel Synthetic Cannabis Dip Test can be used in addition to urine testing and is able to detect the synthetic cannabinoids and this will be available in July. This is certainly a positive when it comes to monitoring this ever emerging drug group. What is clear for us all is that we need to keep up to date with testing, education, and training in this area of our health and safety programmes.

LUUKA JONES CREATES MORE HISTORY

Luuka's silver medal at the ICF Canoe Slalom World Cup in Slovakia on the tricky Bratislava course saw her achieve a faultless performance much like her silver medal at the 2016 Olympics in Brazil.

A great semi final that saw only one error and so Luuka went into the final having qualified fifth. She came home strongly after a slow start to hold the number one position and then Luuka had to wait to see what her competitors times would be. Three paddlers tried and failed but the Austrian who was the last paddler bettered Luuka's time by 0.94 seconds.

Luuka admits, "it was a difficult course but I had a good plan and it was all about me executing the best run I could. I made some mistakes early on and lost time but I kept my composure and came away with the silver." Luuka is now home for a short break before returning to Europe to race in the final World Cup of the season in Prague. September is the World Champs which doubles as an Olympic qualifier.
