## **DELIVERY SITES, ACCESS & TANKS NEED TO BE SAFE**

McFall Fuel is really pleased with the positive approach coming from farmers who are willingly upgrading from the Tripod Tanks with the new purpose built farm tanks as well as making sure the area around the tank is tidy to ensure the best possible safety standards are achieved.



However, recently we have been faced with a number of sites where deliveries have been made unsafe because of either the access to the tank or the stability of the tank. It is important

that sites where deliveries occur are free of obstructions and clutter so that drivers are not clambering over things lying around on the ground to reach

the delivery point. Once they reach the tank it is important that it is stable and that the ladder or step to reach the fill point are also secure and safe. The same expectations for safety apply to into-machine filling. "We have found that the safest into machine deliveries occur when the machinery on site is lined up in an area easily accessed on site and the machine itself is switched off," said Mike Crandon. "Our non-negotiables developed for the Forestry Sector apply equally to construction and earthworks or any other site where machines are filled."
