FARMERS & AG CONTRACTORS AT THE MERCY OF THE WEATHER

Farmers and Ag Contractors are constantly at the mercy of the weather and therefore, November to Christmas 2022 was not ideal for many Regions with the constant rain. When it came to making hay it was nigh on impossible to ensure it was dry before it was baled and in some parts of the North Island flooding meant that the maize that had been planted was washed away and would need to be replanted. The King Country saw grass growing reasonably well and for many areas the silage making was the latest it has ever been done. While prolonged bouts of wet weather can impinge on animal health most are pleased with the feed quality.

Some Regions have had the wettest or close to the wettest season on record while in contrast, the Manawatū, pictured above, has been dryer and the grass is growing really well. The Summer crops were planted earlier than usual and were timed nicely for when the rains came and so now most crops are looking good and well on their way to harvest. The lambs growth rates have increased along with the farm work activities making up for the lost time. Ag Contractors will be looking to make the hay and deal with the maize crops when the weather settles but at present the weather is not playing ball.

LOOKING AFTER OUR SUBSTANTIAL TANK ASSET



"We have reached the point where we have less call outs for repairs because of the annual maintenance planning and the Team also believe we

Our aim is to put in place the cleaning of tanks as well going forward so that we can keep on top of all aspects related to the tank service which we offer. 491 tanks were delivered in 2022 to customers using either the Tank Asset Team, Area Sales
